| 30. | <p><b>Blackstone Merlot, California, 2006</b><br/> <i>Lifted dark cherry and berry aromas with a touch of spicy clove. The palate is supple and well integrated with flavours of cherry and spice. Perfectly demonstrating the Blackstone style, rich fruit aromas, elegance, supple oak characters and soft tannins. 60% of the wine was aged for 12 months in American oak to add subtle oak complexity and richness. Syrah, Petite Sirah and a touch of Cabernet were added to the final blend to give the wine additional density and palate weight.</i></p> | £5.50          | £18                |

38. **Montepulciano d'Abruzzo D.O.C. Guardiagrele, 2004** £33  
*Matured in Slovenian oak barrels, this red has an aroma of great intensity, with a distinct perfume of underwood with elegant notes of fine wood. Intense ruby with shades of blue leading to a full-rich-soft taste, rendered young & pleasant by it's freshness, with balanced tanning without asperity.*
39. **Fleurie, Domaine André Colonge, 2007** £30  
*André Colonge is third generation of wine makers in the Beaujolais area of France. The Gamay grape with 6 months ageing in oak provides you with red berry flavours of raspberry & strawberry* ½ bottle

40. **Valcorso Organic Monastrell, Yecla, La Purísima, 2006** £17  
*Aromas of wild herbs and dried fruits, backed by a smooth finish*
41. **False Bay Pinotage, 2007** £19  
*The indigenous red grape of South Africa – made from a hybrid cross of Cinsault & Pinot Noir grapes, giving peppery flavours of mulberry & black berry fruits*
42. **Riserva Ducale Chianti Classico Riserva, Ruffino, 2005** £33  
*Rich and concentrated, a dark, minerally palate and roasted red fruit and herb character*
43. **Houghton Private Bin Shiraz, Western Australia, 2005** £21  
*Gentle spice and chocolate characters, a round soft palate with subtle tannins and a smooth finish*
44. **Spy Valley Pinot Noir, 2007** £30  
*From the Marlborough area in the North of New Zealand's South Island. The Pinot Noir grapes are hand harvested and this shows hints of flowers, with rich fruity flavours of plum and soft tannins*
45. **Don Jacobo Crianza Rioja Tinto, Spain, 2004** £23  
*Matured raspberry and cherry fruit with hints of vanilla spice on the lingering, velvety finish*
46. **Wynn's Cabernet Sauvignon, Coonawara, 2004** £32  
*Deep red and dense in appearance, firm and full-flavoured, with generous fruit in harmony with the sweet oak finish, and typical Cabernet austerity*
47. **Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Domaine de l'Arnesque, 2007** £36  
*The top wine of the Southern Rhone. It's juicy, full and dark with a warm jammy spiciness*

48. **Nuits-Saint-Georges, Louis Jadot, 1999** £51  
*Classic, rich, seductive Burgandy. A typically pungent Bouquet and a full, sturdy structure*
49. **Baron De Brane, Margaux, 2005** £39  
*Plenty of integrated fruit and oak flavours, supremely elegant, with silky, feminine tannins*
50. **Nero D'Avola Sicilia Terre di Ginestra, Calatrasi, 2006** £23  
*Red violet colour with purple edges. Nose is elegant and savoury Nero d'Avola. Intense palate showing bilberries and prunes with length gained from oak sweetness*
51. **Ravenswood Sonoma County Zinfandel, 2005** £30  
*Big & bold with bright, ripe raspberry and blackberry, vanilla & cinnamon highlights*
