Gavi di Gavi Late Harvest Castello Toledana, Domini Villa Lanata, Italy <i>Made only using the two finest vineyards of the estate in the north-west corner which have created a slightly more minerally wine. The Cortese grapes are not hand-harvested until early November by which time the grapes have begun to shrivel. The concentrated juice is fermented in small French oak barrels and then matured for a further six months in stainless steel.
